

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust, we aim to provide high quality sport. At Durweston, we have provided the following;

- Opportunities for all children to participate in a wider range of different sports
- Opportunities for the older children to compete in local festivals and tournaments
- Opportunities to participate in a range of after school activities – cross country, tennis, taekwondo, netball, cricket, hockey and dance
- Regular Forest School sessions for the whole school
- High quality swimming coaching
- CPL for staff in orienteering

### Impact Report for Last Year

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was £17 080.. The money was used as follows with the impact detailed below.

Activity	Budget	Anticipated Impact
2 x termly Forest School Sessions	£11 000	All children across the school accessed forest school which supported problem solving and team building. Supported them in learning how to take risks and to understand more environmental issues.
Additional 'top up' swimming classes	£1805	12/15 children able to swim 25 meters. 3/15 children offered additional top up lessons
Attendance at all BSN sports events and as many additional events as we can manage	£2100	All children offered the opportunity to take part in a fixture took it up. Successful engagement from all participants and they were able to show resilience and sportsmanship through these.
Orienteering Day	£250	All children were able to read maps and experience field work.

Climbing	£500	100% of children who took part in climbing were able to move out of their comfort zone, have courage and take risks. This supported them for the experience of land and wave coming next year.
Kayaking	£150 supply	Showed collaborative learning skills through this. It also gave the opportunity for those that took part to apply the swimming skills they had learnt in a real-life context of needing it.
Sailing	£75 + £350 + £150 supply	Showed collaborative learning skills through this. It also gave the opportunity for those that took part to apply the swimming skills they had learnt in a real-life context of needing it.
Land and Wave	£700 supply cover for Y5 left in Porps	Took children out of their comfort zone, they showed increased build up of courage and developed independence.

## Monitoring and Evaluation

- This report will be updated at the end of the academic year to identify the success of the above initiatives and the impact that they have had.
- Delivery will be monitored by the P.E. Leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at senior level by the Headteacher and by the Trust.
- We will monitor the take up of activities, including by children entitled to pupil premium funding
- Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by school staff, volunteers and outside agencies to ensure that provision is high-quality. We will review progress against this plan and identify the next steps on a termly basis.

## Sustainability

- At Durweston CE School we use the sports grant to ensure sustainable improvements in sports provision and pupil health in a variety of ways:
- Forest school – gives children the opportunity to be active out of a sports context
- Opportunities to experience activities that are beyond the classroom
- Investing in sports equipment is integral to sustainability. Funding has been used to buy equipment for PE sessions and also break times.
- Our daily mile track is used on a daily basis. The impact of having this greatly benefits all children by allowing more opportunities for physical activity within the school day. We continue to monitor and upkeep this equipment from year to year.
- We have further developed our links with the local prep school 'Bryanston' to support with mini bus use and the use of swimming pool facilities. This enables us to flourish as a large collective, as well as a smaller school. It allows for participation beyond our school, part of our aim to help children understand life beyond their doorstep.
